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NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

PART A: EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO MFRS 134: INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORTING

A1 BASIS OF PREPARATION

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with MFRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") and the requirements of the Companies Act 2016 in Malaysia, where applicable. This condensed consolidated interim financial statements has also been prepared in accordance with the Main Market Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad.

This condensed consolidated financial statements, other than for financial instruments, freehold land and buildings, have been prepared under the historical cost convention. Certain financial instruments are carried at fair value in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standard ("MFRS") 9 Financial Instruments.

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2022. These explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the year ended 31 December 2022.

A2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies and methods of computation applied in the unaudited condensed consolidated interim financial statements are consistent with those adopted in the most recent annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2022, except for the following which were adopted at the beginning of the current financial period. These pronouncements are either not relevant or do not have any material impact on the Group's financial statements for the current financial period:

(a) Adoption of the MFRS, Amendments to MFRS during the current financial period

A3 AUDITORS' REPORT ON PRECEDING FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

There was no qualification on the audited financial statements for the Company or its subsidiaries for the financial year ended 31 December 2022.

A4 SEASONAL OR CYCLICAL FACTORS

The Cookware Division's revenue is subject to seasonality due to market demand and supply conditions. Historically, demand for the premium cookware and kitchenware generally increases in the second half of the year due mainly to the seasonal nature of consumer spending behaviour in the export markets, where the shopping seasons normally peak in the final quarter of the year during festive periods such as Christmas and New Year.

A5 CHANGES IN ESTIMATES

There were no changes in estimates of amounts reported in prior financial period that have a material effect in the current quarter and financial period ended 30 June 2023.

A6 UNUSUAL ITEMS DUE TO THE NATURE, SIZE OR INCIDENCE

There were no unusual items affecting the assets, liabilities, equity, net income or cash flows during the current quarter and financial period ended 30 June 2023.

A7 MATERIAL CHANGES IN ESTIMATES

There were no material changes in estimates that have a material effect on the results for the current quarter and financial period ended 30 June 2023.

A8 ISSUANCE OR REPAYMENT OF DEBT AND EQUITY SECURITIES

Save as disclosed below, there were no issuance and repayment of debt and equity securities, share buy-backs, share dividend, and/or share cancellation for the current quarter and financial period ended 30 June 2023.

(a) Share Buy-backs

At the Annual General Meeting of the Company held on 21 June 2023, the shareholders of the Company had renewed a mandate for the Company to purchase and/or hold up to maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the ordinary shares of the Company as may be determined by the Directors of the Company. The mandate will expire upon the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.

As at 30 June 2023, the total number of shares bought back and held as treasury shares were 49,345,336 ordinary shares, representing 8.61% of the total issued share capital of the Company. The shares purchased are being held as treasury shares. None of the treasury shares were cancelled during the current quarter and financial period ended 30 June 2023.

A8 ISSUANCE OR REPAYMENT OF DEBT AND EQUITY SECURITIES (CONT.)

(b) Redeemable Convertible Preference Shares (RCPS)

The Company has on 3 March 2021 issued 675,863,030 new RCPS with the issue price of RM0.01. The expiry date of the RCPS is 2 March 2026. The conversion price of the RCPS is RM0.12 per share.

A fixed preference dividend rate per annum of 3% of the RCPS issue price (during the tenure of RCPS and up to the date of conversion), shall be payable out of post cumulative taxation profits. The dividends are to be paid annually in arrears. The RCPS can be redeemed during the beginning of the 5th year after issuance until maturity at the RCPS issue price plus any accumulated undeclared dividends up to the date of redemption. The redemption shall be at the option of the holders. All remaining RCPS that are not converted or redeemed during the Tenure shall be mandatorily redeemed by our Company at the RCPS issue price plus any accumulated undeclared dividends up to the date of redemption, subject to requirement of Section 72(6) of the Companies Act 2016, currently in force and as may be amended from time to time and any re-enactment thereof.

As at 30 June 2023, 59,678,600 RCPS were converted into 59,678,600 new ordinary shares pursuant to the exercise of conversion rights of RCPS 2021/2026.

A9 PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at valuation/cost less any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

A10 CHANGES IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE GROUP

There were no changes in the composition of the Group, including business combinations, acquisition or disposal of subsidiaries and long term investments, restructuring and discontinuing operations during the current quarter and financial period ended 30 June 2023, except for the following:

In January 2023, the Company's wholly-owned subsidiary, Ni Hsin EV Tech Sdn. Bhd. ("NHEVT") acquired 425,000 ordinary shares in EVSend Sdn. Bhd. ("EVS"), representing 100% equity interest in EVS for a total cash consideration of RM2,000,000. The principal activity of EVS is eco-friendly on-demand tech-enabled express logistics, and courier services. Subsequent to the acquisition, EVS becomes a wholly-owned subsidiary of NHEVT, which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company.

In February 2023, the Company's wholly-owned subsidiary, Ni Hsin Food & Beverages Sdn. Bhd. ("NHFB") acquired 5,000 ordinary shares in Blackbixon2go Sdn. Bhd. ("BB2GO"), representing the remaining 50% equity interest in BB2GO for a total cash consideration of RM5,000. Subsequent to the acquisition, BB2GO becomes a wholly-owned subsidiary of NHFB, which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company.

In February 2023, NHEVT acquired 1 ordinary shares in EV Mobility Sdn. Bhd. ("EVM"), representing the remaining 50% equity interest in EVM for a total cash consideration of RM1. Subsequent to the acquisition, EVM becomes a wholly-owned subsidiary of NHEVT, which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company.

A11 DIVIDEND PAID

No dividend was paid during the current quarter and financial period ended 30 June 2023.

A12 SEGMENTAL INFORMATION

The Group is principally engaged in the design, manufacture and sale of stainless steel kitchenware, cookware, research and development stainless steel products, food & beverages business and logistics services. B1 OPERATING SEGMENTS REVIEW

Quarter Ended 30 June 2023 ("Q2 2023") vs Quarter Ended 30 June 2022 ("Q2 2022")

The Group's revenue and Loss Before Taxation ("LBT") were approximately RM8.15 million and RM1.75 million respectively for Q2 2023. Revenue in Q2 2023 was lower by 4.21% as compared with the revenue in Q2 2022 mainly due to lower of sales in stainless steel products and logistics services. The Group's gross profit ("GP") margin for Q2 2023 decreased to 16.59% compared with the GP margin of 25.06% achieved in Q2 2022. Other income in Q2 2023 increased slightly to RM0.24 million compared to other loss of RM0.10 million in Q2 2022. Operating expenses in Q2 2023 was consistent as compared with Q2 2022 at RM3.20 million. The Group recorded a LBT of RM1.75 million in Q2 2023 as compared to RM1.14 million in Q2 2022 as a result of lower sales performance. The Loss After Taxation ("LAT") in Q2 2023 was RM1.75 million versus LAT of RM1.00 million recorded in Q2 2022.

6 Months Period Ended 30 June 2023 ("6M2023") vs 6 Months Period Ended 30 June 2022 ("6M2022")

The Group's performance by each Division (after the elimination of inter-segment sales) for the financial period is as follows:

(i) Cookware Division

The Cookware Division's revenue for 6M2023 decreased by RM0.76 million or 13.9% to RM4.70 million compared with the revenue achieved in 6M2022 of RM5.47 million as sales to Japan and USA & Canada decreased by RM0.18 million and RM0.47 million respectively. However, the sales to Europe increased by RM0.01 million. The cookware revenue by geographical market for 6M2023 is as follows:

(ii) Stainless Steel Products Division

The Stainless Steel Products Division's revenue for 6M2023 decreased by RM2.28 million or 26.1% to RM6.46 million compared with the revenue achieved in 6M2022 of RM8.74 million due to lower sales to Thailand, Japan and Korea.

(iii) Food and Beverages Division

The Food and Beverages Division's revenue for 6M2023 was RM1.95 million as compared to RM0.38 million in 6M2022. The Division commenced business in end July 2022.

(iv) Logistics Services

The Logistics Division's revenue for 6M2023 was RM0.94 million as compared to RM2.67 million in 6M2022. The Division generated a lower revenue for the period as supply chains normalise, alleviating some pressure on demand.

(v) Electric Vehicles (EV) Division

The EV Division's revenue for 6M2023 was RM0.71 million having just started operations in January 2023.

The Group's net assets per share as at 30 June 2023 stood at RM0.18. The Group's non-current assets increased to RM65.65 million compared with the non-current assets of RM64.95 million as at 31 December 2022 due to recognition of goodwill and increase in intangible assets of RM1.89 million and RM0.11 million respectively. Inventories decreased to RM21.92 million as at 30 June 2023 due to reduction of inventories level in Cookware Division and Stainless Steel Products Division. Receivables, deposits and prepayments recorded an increase of RM1.28 million to RM6.36 million as compared to that in 31 December 2022. The Group's net current assets was RM40.04 million as at 30 June 2023. The Group is in a positive net cash position as at 30 June 2023 with cash and cash equivalent of RM16.33 million after deducting all borrowings of the Group.

B1 OPERATING SEGMENTS REVIEW (CONT.)

6 Months Period Ended 30 June 2023 ("6M2023") vs 6 Months Period Ended 30 June 2022 ("6M2022") (Cont.)

The Group's net operating cash outflow for 6M2023 was RM0.31 million. The net cash outflow from investing activities was RM2.64 million, being investment in an equity interest of a subsidiary and purchase of plant and equipment. Net cash outflow from financing activities was RM1.02 million, mainly attributable to the cost of repurchase of treasury shares and repayment of bank borrowings. The net resultant impact to the Group's cash flow was a decrease in cash of RM3.98 million during 6M2023. Net cash and cash equivalents amounted to RM17.07 million as at 30 June 2023.

The Group's revenue in Q2 2023 was higher by RM1.49 million compared with Q1 2023. However, the Group GP was lower in Q2 2023. The Group recorded a Loss Before Taxation ("LBT") of RM1.76 million in the second quarter of 2023 as compared to LBT of RM1.18 million in the immediate preceding quarter.

B3 COMMENTARY ON PROSPECT

Global growth is projected to fall from an estimated 3.5 percent in 2022 to 3.0 percent in both 2023 and 2024. While the forecast for 2023 is modestly higher than predicted in the April 2023 World Economic Outlook (WEO), it remains weak by historical standards. The rise in central bank policy rates to fight inflation continues to weigh on economic activity. (Source: IMF)

Malaysian GDP growth lost momentum in the second quarter, falling to 2.9% year on year, from 5.6% in Q1. Q2's reading marked the softest growth since Q3 2021 and surprised markets on the downside. On the domestic front, slowing private spending growth drove the overall deceleration, overshadowing the contribution of stronger growth in public spending and investment. On the external front, exports of goods and services contracted 9.4% in Q2 (Q1: -3.3% yoy), marking the worst result since Q2 2020 amid the global electronics sector downturn and weak international demand. Similarly, imports of goods and services declined at a more pronounced pace of 9.7% in Q2 (Q1: -6.5% yoy).

Looking ahead, GDP growth remains broadly stable in Q3. Domestic demand should continue to expand, supported by government subsidies and lower inflation. Recovering tourist inflows and a projected recovery in the electronics sector later this year should support activity further.

The Group's venture into EV two-wheelers has gained traction and making good progress in terms of promoting the transition from ICE two-wheelers to EV two-wheelers in support of reducing carbon emissions, creating green economy and achieving sustainability. The Group has received very encouraging interests and feedback from engagements with various government departments and agencies as well as corporate entities on the use of EV two-wheelers in security, surveillance, enforcement as well as operational functions.

We foresee healthy growth prospects for our EV two-wheeler business, not just in outright sales of the products but the rent-to-own, rent-to-use and ride sharing business models.

Business at the Blackbixon Café business has been brisk and gaining popularity on social media with its innovative and fresh menu. The Group is planning to open several outlets in the Klang Valley within the next couple of years.

The Board is confident the stainless steel cookware and stainless steel products segment will remain robust. The marketing team has made further inroads in the China and Indonesia markets. The Group will continue to maintain and improve product quality, focus on innovating products portfolio, monitoring costs, broadening the marketing network and addressing the needs of consumers to ensure business continuity.

B4 STATUS OF UTILISATION OF PROCEEDS RAISED FROM CORPORATE PROPOSAL

The total proceeds from the public issue of RCPS amounted to RM6,759,000 has been fully utilised.
