A - NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT PURSUANT TO MFRS 134

Basis of preparation

The consolidated interim financial statements (Condensed Report) are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRS"), International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") and the requirements of the Companies Act, 2016 in Malaysia.

The interim financial statements of the Group and the Company have been prepared on a historical cost basis, unless otherwise disclosed in the significant accounting policies below or other notes to the interim financial statements.

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 August 2022.

As at 31 August 2023, the Group's current liabilities exceeded current assets by RM16.03 million. The Directors are of the view that the Group will have sufficient cash flows for the next twelve months from the reporting date to meet their cash flow requirements. The Directors believe that the Group are able to realise their assets and discharge their liabilities in the normal course of business and that the financial position will be improved through operating profits. Thus, the Directors believe that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements of the Group on a going concern basis

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

2.1 Changes in accounting policies

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year except as follows:

Change in accounting policy for inventories from First-in-First-out method (FIFO) to Weighted Average method (WAC)

The Group and the Company re-assessed their accounting for inventories with respect to valuation of inventories. The Group and the Company had previously measured all inventories using the First-in-First-out (FIFO) method. On 1 September 2022, the Group and the Company elected to voluntarily change the method of valuing inventories to Weighted Average (WAC).

The directors believe that the WAC method would give fairer presentation of the results and financial position of the Group and the Company and provide more relevant and comparable information in enabling users to evaluate financial performance of the Group and the Company than the existing FIFO method. The WAC method is suitable since the inventory units are identical or nearly identical. The WAC method is also widely used by the peer group of companies and it is a prevalent practice within the industry.

The switch from FIFO to WAC method represents a change in accounting policy which must be accounted for retrospectively in the financial statements. Therefore, the change must be applied as if the new accounting policy was always in place.

Consequently, the Group and the Company had adjusted all comparative amounts presented in the financial statements affected by the change in accounting policy for each prior period presented.

3. Auditors' report on preceding annual financial statements

The auditors' report in respect of the annual financial statement for the financial year ended 31 August 2022 was not subject to any qualification.

Seasonal or cyclical factors

The business operations of the Group are not materially affected by any seasonal or cyclical factors. But, the delivery of the Group's product will affected by flood during monsoon season and as well as road block during major festive season.

5. Exceptional items

Exceptional items for current year quarter:

i. There is an increase in fair value of quoted investments totalling RM2.32 million for the current quarter. This represent an increase in market value of our quoted securities held during the current quarter.

5. Exceptional items (Continue)

ii. The pandemic and the weak market sentiment has caused heighten anxiety amongst credit providers due to the uncertainties and serious potential economic impact. The banks went into total risk avoidance mode and were negative bias on all funded credit. The management took necessary steps to connect with all its credit providers to allay concerns and where necessary rescheduled timeline for near-term debt service. The Company is looking into the refinancing of some of the banking lines which has been substantially reduced.

6. Changes in estimates of amounts previously reported

There were no changes in estimates of amounts reported in prior interim periods of the current financial year or in prior financial years that may have a material effects on the current interim period.

7. Issuance or repayment of debt and equity securities

There were no issuance and repayment of debt securities, share buy-backs, share cancellations, shares held as treasury shares and resale of treasury shares by the Company for the financial period under review.

8. Dividends paid

There were no dividend paid for the current quarter under review.

9. Earning/(Loss) per share

Basis earnings/(loss) per share is calculated by dividing the profit/(loss) for the period amounting to RM1.08 million for the Group on the number of ordinary shares in issue of 74,625,000 during the current financial period. There were no movement of issue shares of 74,625,000 during and since the previous financial quarter.

Fully diluted earnings/(loss) per share is not presented as there are no potential dilutive shares.

10. Net assets per share

Net assets per share is calculated by dividing net assets as at 31 August 2023 of RM63.21 million (31 August 2022: RM62.14 million (Restated)) for the Group on the number of shares in issue during the year of 74,625,000 (31 August 2022: 74,625,000).

11. Segmental reporting

The activity of the Group comprises principally the manufacturing and distribution of prestressed spun concrete piles and poles and is conducted predominantly in Malaysia.

B. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER THE LISTING REQUIREMENTS

1. Review of Performance

FYE 4Q2023 compared with FYE 4Q2022 (Restated)

The Group's revenue and gross profit margin for the current quarter decrease 10.52% and 15.44% as compared to the preceding year quarter maily due to product mix and slow take-off by the overseas customer.

2. Comparisons with preceding quarter's results

There is an increase of sales of 20.30% and decrease in gross profit margin of 56.43% in the current quarter compared with the preceding quarter in FY 3Q2023 mainly due to the product mix.

3. Financial position and liquidity

Total assets of the Group stood at RM136.76 million at 4Q2023, an increase of RM2.19 million from 3Q2023 mainly due to increase in other investment and trade receivable and offset by inventory.

Total liabilities of the Group decrease RM2.76 million from RM76.30 million at 3Q2023 as compare to 4Q2023, mainly due to decrease in bank borrowing and offset by trade payables.

Equity attributable to equity holders of the Group was RM63.21 million as at 4Q2023 with net assets per share at RM0.85.

The Group's cash and cash equivalents has decrease by RM0.27 million in 4Q2023 as compare to 3Q2023, this was mainly due to slow payment from customer.

4. Current year prospects

The outlook for the FYE 2023 remains challenging due to uncertainty for both domestic and overseas market. The ongoing trade wars between China and the United States and Russia – Ukraine war has dealt a major shock to commodity markets and disrupted the world production and trade. This in turn may affect the demand for the Group's products and increase in the cost of goods sold correspondingly assert a downward pressure on the Group's revenue and margins.

The lack of foreign direct investments into Malaysia especially on mega contruction and infrastructure projects and the stableness of the new government also has an impact to our revenue. This coupled with the price rising on cement, steel and international inbound charges, further with the reducing of the weekly working hours will certainly offset our performance and profitability of the Group. To mitigate the impact on price rising, CEPCO practiced price escalation clause in the quotation and contract to enable CEPCO transfer the price increase to customers.

The Group will continue to be vigilant on its capital expenditure and cash conservation measures in its business and will focus on securing sales in both local and overseas market. The Board will take the necessary measures to manage and mitigate these uncertainties in order to optimise the Group performance and will continue to implement any necessary action plans to minimise the Group losses and improve the Group cash flows to mitigate the adverse impact on the Group performance.

5. Variance from profit forecast and profit guarantee

The Group did not issue any profit forecast or profit guarantee for the financial period under review.
